

Helping Borderline to help our clients

Borderline works with homeless and insecurely housed Scots in London, supporting them in their search for a home and a secure life.

This is what we can do with whatever you choose to give:

- £2.50 buys a personal hygiene pack
- £4.70 is the cost of a one day travel card to an outer London hostel
- £12 pays for a birth certificate
- £30 enables us to issue a travel warrant
- £80 pays for our freephone helpline for a month
- £170 pays for one week in a London hostel
- £250 is the average cost to help a Borderline client furnish a flat

SCOTS IN LONDON



Based in Victoria near the coach station, the route many Scots take to London, Borderline's team of five staff offers a range of services including information, advice and advocacy. We might help clients obtain a birth certificate so they can access housing benefits. We can help them find a room in a hostel, and we can access referrals to alcohol, drug and mental health counselling services.

Working closely with partner agencies and institutions in Scotland, Borderline's "Chance" project offers clients the opportunity for planned, permanent resettlement to Scotland.

Peter lost his job when the contract came to an end, and then couldn't keep up with his rent. Borderline managed to place him in a hostel, and he found a job on the railways. Being very frugal, Peter managed to save up sufficient money to pay a deposit, and we helped him find suitable rented accommodation. We also accessed a charitable grant for him to purchase household equipment, and Peter now has a successful tenancy.
